

HOMO-SAPIENS

ON THE DAY OF HALLOWEEN 2011, SOURCES PREDICTED THAT THE SEVEN BILLIONTH PERSON ENTERED OUR WORLD. TRENDS SHOW THAT THE WORLD PROBABLY ONLY REACHED ONE BILLION PEOPLE AROUND THE YEAR 1800.

Martyn Thompson was born in Nottingham, England in 1982. He studied art at Oxford College and then Northampton University before moving to Korea in 2007.

These works compile hundreds of individual snapshots of various places in to a montage. The works are then digitally editted, then printed on to perspex panels. Whole images are completed with a back lit LED panel, allowing the viewer to been captured by a unique sense of depth.

Martyn has drawn inspirations from experimental photographers from the past such as Edweard Muybridge, Jules Ettiene-Marie, Man Ray and David Hockney and video artist Baek Nam June.

Combining elements of traditional photography with technological processe, these new works, on display for the first time, form a fusion between man's development of technology of the past, and explore the expansion of of our species through the digital age.



For this exhibition, Jon attempts to capture some of the various behaviors 'homo sapiens' exhibit using real-life events and depictions of possible ones. He believes that humans are complex, social beings with an array of emotions used in our daily lives and displays this in his artwork.
